Drugs in road traffic – Nordic Meeting Point

11 May 2017, 10.00 a.m. – 3.00 p.m. in Stockholm

Between 20 and 30 per cent of all fatal accidents in traffic in the Nordic countries are alcohol or drug-related. In what way can authorities, researchers, and voluntary organizations contribute to a decrease in such accidents?

The project "Drug-free traffic in the Nordic countries" gathers participants working within this field to discuss the continuing work concerning drugs and medicines in traffic.

What do we know about drugs in traffic in the Nordic countries? What do the police and other authorities do to bring down the number of accidents in which drugs are involved in the Nordic countries? What possibilities and limitations do the national regulations create as regards an efficient follow-up of the use of drugs in traffic? Is there a need for a joint standard for equipment for drug testing?

These are some of the topics that will be discussed at the meeting.
